1. 4-H or FFA members with projects consisting of beef steers & market heifers, barrows, market lambs, rabbit meat pens, poultry pens, market goats, dairy animals, and carcass animals must follow the steps below to be eligible for the Livestock Sale.
2. An exhibitor's name may appear only once on the sale bill. **A 4-H member enrolled in more than one livestock project must notify the Iroquois County Fair Office (not the 4-H Office) by 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday as to the one specie you intend to sell, or you will not sell. An Iroquois County 4-H Livestock and Food Exhibit Information Form must be filled out and submitted with your 4-H or FFA enrollment forms. The Extension Office or FFA Advisor will email you a link to complete this online form.**
3. Animals sold must be an actual part of the member's project and must have been shown in the proper class before they are eligible to be sold in the livestock sale.
4. All questions not covered in these rules shall be taken up by the sale committee. Their decision shall be final.
5. **4-H members who are enrolled in both Nutrition and Livestock projects may only auction off one project.**
6. All sales are final. Each 4-H or FFA exhibitor may sell one (1) of the following:
 - a. One Steer, One Market Heifer, or One Beef Carcass
 - b. One barrow, or One Swine Carcass
 - c. One wether,; Champion Market Ewe Lamb, or One Sheep Carcass
 - d. Champion or Reserve Champion 4-H or FFA Market Goat, and all wethers
 - e. Meat pen of rabbits (maximum of 8 pens)
 - f. Maximum of 6 poultry pens to sell. Champion pen of poultry derived from a maximum of five pens of 4-H poultry; plus the FFA Grand Champion Pen of Poultry, 4-H pens selling include: 4-H Grand Champion Pen of Poultry, Champion Pen of Fryers, Champion Pen of Roasters, Champion Pen of Turkeys and Champion Pen of Waterfowl. Reserve Champions may move up to sell.
7. Dairy – Basket of Cheese from each Breed Grand Champion, or Dairy Feeder Steer, or Market Steer. Reserve Champions may move up to sell. Buyers of the Dairy Baskets of Cheese will receive the basket of cheese.
8. Beginning in 2021 the order of the Sale will rotate its order by barn. The order of selling will be Sheep, Beef, Rabbits, Goats, Poultry, Swine, and Dairy. Based on this order, the Grand Champions will sell first then the Reserve Champion, followed by the breed champions. If the Grand Champion elects not to sell the Reserve Champion may sell their animal in its place.
9. All exhibitor's MUST be in the sale ring when it's time to sell or they will go to the end of the sale list.
10. All awards, introductions and announcements will be held only from 12:45 to 1:00 p.m. prior to start of the Sale.
11. All extra events MUST be approved by the fair board prior to Sale Day.
12. The exhibitor retains ownership of their animal and handles where it will be going.
13. Each exhibitor will receive a check for the premium money minus the 10% commission.
14. Multiple Buyer Sheet will be available for those individuals who want to create Buyer Groups. Exhibitors do not have to create Buyer groups. Buyer Group Guidelines are as follows:
 - A. All individuals on the list must have a current Buyer Number as of 2019. Numbers may be requested from a form located on iroquoisfair.com.
 - B. All information must be filled out on the sheet.
 - C. The group leader will be the contact person to help collect the money.
 - D. The buyer in position number one agrees to cover any overage or underage if the sale amount is different than the total amount of the sheet.
 - E. In the event that this sheet is outbid on the sale, buyers on this sheet who want to still donate may do so. The contact person needs to let the Fair Office know after the Sale is over and by noon on Saturday which buyers need to be added.
 - F. There is a \$25.00 minimum contribution amount per buyer on the sheet.
 - G. Additions to buyer sheet can be added during the live sale.
 - H. Any blank sale amount boxes will share equally the difference between the total amount donations and sale amount awarded on live sale.
 - I. Please make sure you talk to your buyers and get permission to use their buyer number.
 - J. Turn the Multiple Buyer Sheet into your Building Superintendent or person in charge of Buyer Sheets. They in turn will turn in all forms for their department to Fair Office by Noon on the day of the sale.
15. Any Buyer who does not pay for their bill or writes an NSF check will be prohibited from participating in future sales.
