Exhibitor's Instructions

1. General Rules apply to all exhibitors.
2. 4-H entries must be made through 4-H leader. FFA entries must be made through FFA Advisor.
3. All open and junior show entries must be made as outlined in the general rules through the Fair Office.
4. Camper Permit were mailed out in May for last year's campers. New camper applications can be found on our website.
5. All entries in the Open Class and Junior Show will close at 6:00 p.m. Thursday, July 3, 2025, and at 2:00 pm Tuesday, July 8th for late entries, except Tractor Pulling Contest, Horse & Pony Shows (Department R), and the Open & Youth Sanction Rabbit Show which accept entries on show day. All entries shall be in place by the time indicated in departmental rules. **LIVESTOCK WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO UNLOAD BEFORE 7:00 a.m. ON TUESDAY, JULY 15, 2025. No Entry Fees will be refunded on changes made after July 3, 2025. (Social Security number is required)**
6. All livestock exhibitors are required to fill out the Animal Identification Blank. This form is to be turned in to your livestock superintendent with your health papers upon arrival at the fairgrounds. The Code of Ethics in the General Rules will be strictly enforced. Registration papers for all purebred animals must be available for inspections and remain on the Fairgrounds.
7. If you have any questions about filling out entry blank call Debbie Kroner @ (815)228-2924 or email: debkrones@gmail.com. Individual appointments can be made by contacting Debbie to set one up.
8. Premise ID is recommended for All Livestock entries. Beef, Dairy & Swine must have 840 Tags.
9. Online Registration link is available on website – www.iroquoisfair.com. Online Registration closes on July 3, 2025 for on-time registrations and July 8th for late registrations.
10. Entry Tags will be mailed for a \$2.00 fee if received by June 30th or they may be picked up at the Fair Office.

Pageant Rules

Contestants must complete an Official Entry Blank no later than the first program practice, which stipulates the following conditions for competition.

1. Contestant must be an Iroquois County resident or have attended an Iroquois County school. Anyone that has been a member in an Iroquois County 4-H club for a minimum of 2 years will be eligible to compete.
2. Contestant must be the minimum of sixteen (16) years of age by July 1, 2025, and not have reached their twenty-second (22) birthday by January 1, 2025.
3. Contestant must be a U.S. Citizen.
4. Contestant must be single and never have been married or had a marriage annulled.
5. Contestant can never have been pregnant. Nor is she the adoptive parent of a child.
6. Contestant was born female and has always been female.
7. Contestant can never have been convicted of a felony offense.
8. Contestant does not use or consume any illegal controlled substances or abuse the use of alcohol or other dangerous substances.
9. Contestant is of good moral character. She has never performed any act or engaged in any activity or employment that is or could be characterized as immoral or indecent. She attests that any and all online depictions associated with her name and likeness including, but not limited to Facebook and Myspace, are consistent with the standards and dignity of Miss Iroquois County.
10. Contestant will be judged as follows: Personal Interview 35%, Speech and Communication Skills 30%, Stage Presence (in Evening Gown) 20%, and Beauty and Physique (in Swimsuit) 15%. There is no talent performance required for this contest although the contestant will give a one-minute speech.
11. No Preliminary contest will be held unless deemed necessary by the Pageant committee of this contest. All contestants will be notified in case of a preliminary contest.
12. Contestant agrees, if chosen Queen, to participate in public relations for the Iroquois County Fair and County by appearing at other county fairs, in parades, and at other events suggested by the Pageant Directors.
13. Contestant, if chosen Queen, is required to attend County Fair Day at the Illinois State Fair on August 7, 2025. She will also be required to compete at the Illinois Association of Agricultural Fairs' Queen Pageant in January 2026 and must be available from the Thursday preceding the competition to the Monday morning following the contest. She will abide by the rules and regulations of the IAAF Queen Pageant and will compete with the utmost sportsmanship.
14. Contestant, if chosen Queen, agrees to prepare for the state competition exclusively with the Pageant Directors and/or Committee, or another person they deem fit.
15. Contestant must understand that by competing she is freely agreeing to the conditions set forth in the Official Entry Blank and will abide by them if named Miss Iroquois County Fair Queen 2025. If at any time she is unable to fulfill her obligations as the reigning queen, she will relinquish her title, crown, scholarship, cash award, and any prizes awarded to her. The Executive Committee of the Iroquois County Fair Association and the Pageant Directors have the right of recall should any negative circumstances occur. Any Queen recalled will be succeeded by the next eligible runner-up.
16. Contestants under the age of 18 must have a parent/legal guardian's written consent.
17. Cash Prizes – Queen \$200 & \$1,000 Scholarship from Pageant Committee
18. 1st Runner-up \$500, 2nd Runner-up \$250

Little Miss Iroquois County Fair Pageant

1. A contestant in the Little Miss Iroquois Fair Queen Pageant must be a resident of Iroquois County.
2. Contestants must be a US Citizen and must be a resident of Iroquois County.
3. Ages 6-7. A contestant must be a minimum of 6 years of age and not have reached her 8th birthday by September 1, 2025. Maximum number of contestants will be 15.
4. Once a contestant has been named Little Miss Iroquois County Fair Queen, she cannot compete in said pageant again.
5. Contestants need to attend practices. It is mandatory to attend dress rehearsal on Monday, July 14th, 2025.
6. Contestants agree to appear on stage in a street length dress and answer a pop question and be able to speak in microphone. Contestants and PARENT or GUARDIAN agree that the decision of the judges is FINAL.
7. Little Miss will represent Iroquois County Fair during fair week and other events that have been approved by pageant directors. Also return to crown next year's recipient. Contestants, PARENTS or GUARDIAN agrees to abide by all rules of said pageant and agree to NOT attend more events than what are scheduled for said Queen. This includes all rules now in effect or hereafter to be announced.
8. Any reports of misconduct or the inability to follow rules by new QUEEN or PARENT or GUARDIAN will result in immediate dismissal of title.

(All group forms must be received for the group to qualify.) Entries will be accepted in the order they are received.
2. All Contestants may appear in multiple acts with a maximum of 2.
3. All Contestants must be of amateur status, those who have been paid performing in your area of talent are not eligible.
4. Accompaniment is acceptable. Please bring a USB or send a link to the music to iroquoiscountyfairtalent@gmail.com. No like talent is allowed. I.e., tap sound for tap dancers, background vocals for singers. Bands, musician must play your instrument live. No background music or recording is allowed. If you have any questions, please contact a committee member at iroquoiscountyfairtalent@gmail.com.
5. Any act that goes over four (4) minutes of performance time will be disqualified.
6. There is a 3-minute setup time.
7. All acts must be memorized.
8. All contestants are responsible for making his or her own entry, including their legal name. Alternates in group performances must also fill out a form. Correctly completed forms received by the deadline date. Groups may NOT include a name of a business, school, organization, or other community service group.
9. 1st place winners from another fair talent show “this season” may only participate as an exhibition. Your signature on the bottom of the entry form is a contract stating that if you are the 1st Place Winner at the Iroquois County Fair Talent Show, you will only represent Iroquois County at the IAAF State Talent Show.
10. All contestants must be single and never married and a resident of Illinois or regularly enrolled in a school located in Illinois.
11. Contestants must supply their equipment. Microphones, CD player, piano and plug ins for contestants’ instruments will be provided by the fair’s hired sound personnel.
12. Judging is based on one hundred (100) points.
 - Costume-10,
 - Audience appeal-10,

 - Ability-50.The decisions of the judges will be final.
13. Participation ribbons will be awarded to all contestants. Trophies will be awarded to the top 3 place contestants in both competitive divisions along with prize money of \$100, \$50, \$25. 1. Drawbars - All classes, except OPEN, will pull from a stock appearing drawbar in a stock mounting location. No loop welded drawbars. All drawbars will be measured & checked at weigh-in. The top of the drawbar will not exceed 20" measured from the ground. The minimum distance from the center of the axle to the center of the hitch pin hole will be 18". Drawbar pull point can be straight or "drop" configuration.
2. Fast Hitches (IHC) - Fast hitches (IHC) must be fixed rigid so as not to be able to move when pulling. The top of the hitch will be 20", measured at weigh-in.
3. Safety Hitches - All classes except OPEN will utilize the event-supplied "safety hitch."
4. Pressed steel wheels - will be allowed however, the correct tire width must be used for the model tractor entered on classes 7500# and below. For classes 9,000 & 10,500 pressed steel rims may be used with a maximum of 18.4x38 tires on a 16" rim. No aluminum rims.
5. Weight classes will be 4500#, 6000#, 7500#, 9000# and 10,500# & OPEN (depending on event schedule). Plow class will also be assigned to each tractor, e.g., an II-IC '1 M' will not be allowed to compete in the 4500# class since it's rated as 3 plow tractor vs a 2 plow of an IHC 'I-I' 1 2 plow tractor. A M-M "G" will be considered a 7500#, 4 plow tractor.
6. Engine RPMS - Classes 7500# & below will produce no more than stock advertised rpms. Classes 9000# & 10,500# will be allowed stock plus 10% RPMs will be checked at scale during weigh-in. RPMs of top three finishers may be checked prior to official finish announcement.
7. Front Weight Brackets - brackets will be allowed on any tractor, however not "extended pulling brackets." They may be homemade or factory, however the weight mounting point may not extend beyond the normal front of the tractor. Every effort should be made on home-made brackets to keep the

weights as close as possible to the tractor frame. Weights do not have to match tractor make. Batteries or tanks will not be allowed on front brackets.

8. Tractors will be stock appearing to include hoods, grills and fuel tanks.
9. These rules can be amended by the promoters or organizers of any of the events mentioned in rule 1
10. Weight class pull order may be altered at the event at the discretion of the promoters or organizers. Ex: The event may start with the 7500# class, then proceed to the 6000#, then the 4500# class.
11. No turbo-charged tractors will be allowed, even if the turbo is removed.
12. Tires may not be mechanically "cut," however worn tires are acceptable.
13. Must be a member of Slow Boys. The weigh-in will be at the fairgrounds from 9-11 a.m. Entries close at 11 a.m.
14. Tractor must be a 1964 or older. No professional tractors - must furnish own clevis and hitch pin.
15. Judge's decision is final.
16. The Fair Association or its representatives are not responsible for accidents.

Open & Junior Class General Livestock Rules

1. These rules apply to all classes in the Open & Junior Livestock Departments. Please read and follow these rules. Rules may change based upon laws or acts that affect the fair are made after the printing of the Fair Book. Any changes made will be posted on Facebook and the Fair's website.
2. Open class entries are open to the world. Junior Entries are limited exclusively to Illinois residents. Junior Class entries are open to boys and girls who are 8 years of age or in third grade and not yet 21 years of age on or before September 1 of the year prior to the fair.
3. All non-exhibitors, age 6 and older, must pay daily admission (\$5.00) or have a season pass (\$17.00).
4. Each exhibitor must purchase an exhibitor pass at the time of making entries, a firm being treated as an exhibitor. Only one member of the firm will be admitted to the grounds on this ticket, which entitles their firm to compete or exhibit. 4-H members are given a free pass and may not purchase an exhibitor pass.
5. The interpretation of all rules governing the Open & Junior Fairs shall rest entirely with the Fair Association and their decisions shall be final.
6. **Lights out in all Livestock Barns at 11:00 pm.**
7. No concealed firearms will be allowed on the fairgrounds.
8. No Alcoholic beverages allowed on the fairgrounds. Use and possession of intoxicating beverages for livestock and/or human consumption is strictly prohibited on the fairgrounds.
9. No dogs will be allowed on the fairgrounds except for the 4-H Dog Show and those must be on a leash.
10. Unsportsmanlike conduct, abusive/foul language, possession of, or partaking in consumption of alcoholic beverages, fighting, or inappropriate behavior as deemed by the Superintendent and Fair Board Officials will be grounds for dismissal from the fairgrounds and forfeiture of any premiums.
11. No trucks or trailers may drive on the inside track area from Tuesday noon until Monday morning of the following week. The east side of the track from the bathroom to 4-H Center is closed from Monday morning until Monday of the following week.
12. **Entryways/exits to barns must be clear of people, equipment, tents, chairs, etc. at ALL Times.**
13. Junior Show classes must be separate and distinct classes from the open and 4-H show classes and must be shown & competitively judged separately from the 4-H and open shows or exhibitions. (Section 260.95 d)
14. County 4-H shows or exhibitions must have separate and distinct classes from junior and open show classes. (Section 260.300 b)

Entries

15. Make entries legible, using entry blanks and supplying all information requested, including the number of pens and stalls, breed of livestock, and number of livestock entered. Exhibitors are requested to submit their entries as early as possible as this will save office work and will be to the advantage of both the exhibitor and association. Social Security Numbers are required on all entries. No exceptions. Premise ID number is recommended for ALL livestock exhibitors.
16. Tack Stalls will be granted if stalls are available. Just because you pay for a tack pen does not mean that you will receive one.
17. No exhibitor will be permitted to make more than two entries in any one class which is considered as one premium number. Each exhibitor may show as many breeds as they wish.
18. ANYONE entering livestock in the Open Class or Junior Show must pay a one-time stall or pen rent per specie. **The only exception applies to 4-H members who are only showing in 4-H and not in any Open or Junior Show.**
19. A charge of \$40.00 will be made for all checks returned for Not Sufficient Funds.

Show Requirements

20. All livestock must be on the fairgrounds from 12:00 p.m. Tuesday until 2:00 pm on Sunday. All Exhibitors are responsible for barn cleanup. (No exhibitor shall remove any exhibit or any part of any exhibit without

permission of the Board of Directors. Premiums will be in jeopardy if these rules are not followed). NO EARLY RELEASES WILL BE ALLOWED in accordance with state rule (see Sections 260.50a) and 260.55a5) & C-Part 260 Fair Operation Under the Agricultural Fair Act. Early release to go to another fair is NOT allowed NOR is the superintendent allowed to release early.

21. Exhibits and livestock are required to be in place for exhibition on the fairgrounds for a minimum of three days, except for exhibits and livestock, in 4-H club shows, junior shows, one-day shows and in Departments C, E, Q, R, S, T, V, and Z. The Jr. Horse Show follows the 72- hour exhibition time. The County Fair Board may require specified exhibits and livestock to stay beyond the minimum 72-hour exhibition time. The number of days the exhibition or livestock must be on the fairgrounds for exhibition shall be indicated in the Premium Book. If recommended by the county Fair's veterinarian and approved by fair management, early dismissal of livestock may be granted for the following reasons: disease outbreak, severe hot weather, or other existing conditions which may result in the death of livestock. The Bureau may also grant early dismissal of livestock and other exhibits in emergency situations upon recommendation of fair management in the case where facilities have been lost due to fire, wind, or heavy rain damage to tents and barns, or loss of electrical power, or if facilities cannot accommodate livestock due to space limitations.
22. **All animals exhibited must be owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor, and records must be available for any animals if requested by the fair management. Each exhibitor must personally care for the animal during the feeding period, including show preparation and getting animals to ring and back, or required tenure of ownership. Parents may assist their child with this process. All purebred animals shown must be owned by the exhibitor and must be registered in the name of the exhibitor. No partnership agreements. Registration papers for ALL purebred animals must be available for inspection or premiums will be withheld. Registration papers must remain on the fairgrounds throughout the fair.**
23. **Show conflicts are unavoidable. Other individuals may show an animal as long as they follow age and show requirements and the superintendent has been notified of the show conflict. On the day of an Open Show, an exemption may be granted by the Superintendent to allow other individuals to show an exhibitor's animal for the purpose of promoting future growth of the department. Junior Show - All animals must be exhibited in the show ring by the owner unless special permission is granted by the Superintendent/Board of Directors; and then, only by other Junior Show exhibitors.**
24. **Health papers and animal identification papers must be turned into barn superintendents by noon on Tuesday. If Health papers are not submitted, the animals will not be able to remain on Fairgrounds.** Health papers will be returned at cleanup on Sunday.
25. Show order will be as printed in fair book.
26. All exhibitors of champions and individuals who show more than one specie or have more than one grand champion must notify the **FAIR OFFICE BY WEDNESDAY AT 7:00 pm** which specie or champion will be selling on Livestock Sale except rabbits and they will notify as soon as the meat pens have been judged on Thursday.
27. **ALL LIVESTOCK TRAILERS FOR EXHIBITS STAYING LONGER THAN ONE DAY MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE FAIRGROUNDS AFTER UNLOADING BY 4:00 pm TUESDAY TO FREE UP PARKING.** Trailers staying for one day only should park in areas designated by Fair Officials to free up space for parking. NO livestock trucks and trailers will be allowed to be parked in campground area. No EXCEPTIONS.
28. All superintendents in each department shall have the right and responsibility to settle any controversy which may arise in their department. Superintendents cannot make changes to the fair book.
29. When bringing exhibits to the fair, report to the superintendent in charge of the department in which you have entered. Be sure that your entries are properly made. **All animals must be checked in with the Superintendents.**
30. Superintendents of each department shall arrange and supervise all exhibits within their department. No exhibitor will be permitted to reserve pens or stalls for feed and equipment at their own discretion.

Department Superintendents will assign ALL pen space. All pens must have name cards which can be obtained from the superintendent for State Inspector information.

31. All animals must be exhibited in such places and at such times as the superintendent in charge shall direct. The owner of such animals must have the same in readiness for examination and exhibition at the time set to avoid delay. Exhibitor is responsible for having livestock and other exhibits in the show ring at the time classes are called. This rule must be strictly obeyed.
32. Superintendent and Assistants will determine breed at scales if there is a question. No class changes will be allowed after scales close.
33. If three breeders do not exhibit 10 or more animals in a particular breed, then the classes within that breed will be combined the following year, or in any other department if entries deem insufficient to warrant a class, then that class will be either dropped or combined with another category.
34. If the same animal(s) are shown in 4-H Show, FFA Show, Junior Show and Open Show classes, they must be shown under the same exhibitor's name (for example, only the person whose name appears on the entry blanks may show the animal(s) in all the shows.
35. Any exhibitor washing an animal in an inappropriate spot other than a wash rack will forfeit all their premiums.
36. Each exhibitor will be responsible for keeping their pens and stables clean and bedded. Alleys and pens are to be kept clean and free from all debris, all feed boxes, pails and show equipment must be kept neatly stored.
37. Livestock exhibitors desiring to use a portable generator during the fair must meet the rules set forth by the State Fire Marshall and the Iroquois Co. Fair Board. **No generators will be permitted without first registering it with the fair secretary and securing a permit. Only 1 fan per 3 animals allowed.**
38. No one shall be allowed in the show area while the exhibit is being judged except the exhibitor and helper. Any exhibitor attempting to interfere with judges during their judging will be promptly excluded from competition.
39. The decision of the judges will be final, and no appeal will be considered. Exhibitors may be barred from competition for trying to influence or finding fault with the judges' decision.
40. PROTEST: Any exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit \$25.00 with the Secretary, which sum will be forfeited to the Iroquois County Agricultural and 4-H Club Fair Association if protest is not sustained. All protests must be made in writing, signed by the protestor, and be lodged within six (6) hours after showing.
41. Neither the Secretary or any officer of the Fair shall disclose to competitors or any other person, what entries have been made, nor shall any other person, other than the Secretary and officers of the Fair, be allowed to know what other entries have been made before entries close.
42. Exhibitors display their exhibits at their own risk.
43. Sponsors of the show will take every precaution to prevent injury or sickness to exhibitors or to livestock occurring in connection with the show.
44. While every precaution will be taken by the management to avoid thefts and accidents, the Fair Association cannot and will not be responsible for accidents or damage to exhibitors or anyone in attendance. In no case shall the Iroquois County Fair or any of its officers or directors be held responsible in damages for any loss, damage injury, or disability by disease or from the theft of from any other cause to such property, or to any person coming upon said fairgrounds, while said person or property are on the Iroquois County Fairgrounds.
45. The Iroquois County Fair Association hereby refuses to assume responsibility for the safety as bailee or otherwise, of any property brought upon said fairgrounds—said property being brought upon and kept upon said grounds at the owner's risk.
46. The Iroquois County Agricultural & 4-H Club Fair Association refuses to assume responsibility for injuries to the person of any exhibitor or their officers and employees or to any patron or other persons coming upon the fairgrounds, but no claim for injury to any person or property shall be asserted or suit instituted or maintained against the Iroquois County Fair, its officers, agents, representatives or contractual representatives from said cause by any person having license or privilege to exhibit on the

fairgrounds or occupying any space thereon, and it is part of the consideration for such license or privilege that such claims for damages are specifically waived.

Premiums

47. Premiums will be paid out at the pay windows as soon as they are ready. Announcements will be made via the PA system as to when Pay Windows will open. Tentative Pay window hours are noon to 7:00 pm.
48. Superintendents shall record winners, affix ribbons, and be responsible for returning appropriate information to the Fair Office for payment of premiums as soon as show is over. Payments of premiums can be authorized only upon accurate entries contained in the judge's book therein.
49. The Superintendents will assure that award books are returned to the Fair Office properly certified by the judge and superintendent of the Department as soon as the awards are concluded. Superintendents and Judges' affidavits must be signed before payment of premiums.
50. The Iroquois County Fair intends to award all prizes and premiums listed within the premium book.
51. Payments for premiums are based on the continued funding from the Illinois Department of Agriculture's premium fund for agricultural fairs. The Iroquois County Fair reserves the right to amend premiums and prizes based upon support from this fund.
52. The Treasurer of the Iroquois County Fair Association reserves the right to cancel or stop payment on any check issued by them if not cashed within 60 days after the date of issuance.
53. All premiums will be paid in full, if receipts warrant it, on or before October 1 following the closing of the fair. Premiums will not be paid for any event not held.
54. A charge of \$40.00 will be made for all checks NSF.

Release of Livestock Rules

- A. Early release of animals can be authorized by Fair President, or General Livestock Superintendent (not building superintendents or Fair Board members).**
- B. Release time 2:00 pm Sunday.**
- C. Livestock CANNOT be loaded on trailer prior to release time.**
- D. Tack may be loaded ahead of time but after church service. Trailers may not be in area of barns.**
- E. Do NOT block roadways while loading.**
- F. Trailers may NOT be driven on or loaded from the inside main circle driveway.**

55. Premises Registration is encouraged to exhibit livestock (beef, dairy, horses, swine, sheep, goats, poultry, and rabbits) at the Illinois county fairs/State Fair.
56. Registering a premise involves obtaining a seven-character alpha-numeric "identifier" for the farm, ranch, veterinary clinic, or other site where livestock or fowl are handled, housed, managed, or processed.
57. Choosing to register your premises puts you on the frontline of controlling and preventing the spread of animal disease. A disease outbreak cannot be predicted, but it can impact every segment of animal agriculture. Participation ensures that you have the information you need when you need it most to protect your animals and your investment.
58. If an exhibitor wants to register their animals, an application form can be found on-line at www.agr.state.il.us/premiseid. Exhibitors who register on-line will receive a premises registration number immediately. An application can also be obtained by calling 866-299-9256. If completing an application and returning by mail, it may take up to 4 weeks to receive the number.

2. Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial & national levels.
3. **All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.**
4. The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:
5. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
6. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
7. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
8. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.
9. If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed vet.
10. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
11. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
12. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
13. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

14. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether he or she was instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
15. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
16. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or responsible person that he or she has read the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics" and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act

The provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act (510 ILCS 70; "Act") apply to companion animals and livestock. It is the responsibility of event organizers, animal owners, and participants to be aware of practices and activities that may be considered violations of the Act. Violations of the Act are considered criminal offenses and are prosecuted by county state's attorneys. Event organizers, animal owners, and participants should ensure the following:

- An adequate supply of fresh water shall be provided to animals at all times except when an animal is participating in an event.
- In the event of environmental extremes, such as extreme heat or severe inclement weather, animals must be provided with proper shelter.
- The use of an electric prod on livestock in a chute should not be allowed unless the animal has balked or stalled after the chute has been opened.
- Tail twisting, pulling, and raking over fences when an animal is in the chute or as the chute is being opened should not be allowed.
- An electric prod may only be used while sorting livestock when absolutely necessary and may only touch the animal on the hip or shoulder area. Any overuse of electric prods is prohibited.
- Animals that are sore, lame, sick or injured should not be allowed to participate in the event.
- Veterinary care must be provided to prevent suffering. Any animal sustaining injury at any time must be provided with appropriate veterinary care. The Department encourages all events to maintain a relationship with a local veterinarian to ensure treatment is accessible in a timely manner.
- All events must be conducted humanely. Participants must consider the species, size, age and condition of an animal before its use in an event and whether the event can be conducted humanely.
- Practices such as calf tailing are not exempt from the humane care provisions of the Act.
- All horses must have a current equine infectious anemia test and horses originating from out-of-state must have a current interstate certificate of veterinary inspection.

It is the responsibility of each person associated with an event, including the animals' owners/caretakers, to ensure compliance with all Illinois laws pertaining to animal health and welfare at all times. Approved humane investigators, law enforcement or other entities that observe potential violations of the Humane Care for Animals Act should report those to the county state's attorney at which the event occurred.

2025 Exhibition Livestock Health Requirements

County Fairs

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

These Exhibition Health Requirements apply to all livestock present at the fair including those animals that are not entered in competitive events.

1. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits. All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.
2. All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which shows that the animal meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois. CVI's shall be made available to Bureau of Animal Health Personnel on request. If an official electronic CVI is utilized, the exhibitor should be able to log on and show Bureau of Animal Health Personnel the completed CVI. CVI means a legible record made on an official form from the state of origin which has been issued, signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian and which shows the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor and the results of all required tests or vaccinations. A CVI shall list only one animal identification per line; shall be presented on the form on which it was initially issued; and shall not be corrected, changed or altered in any manner.
3. All animals shall be officially identified. The animal(s) official identification shall be recorded on the CVI. Animal identification number (AIN): A numbering system for the official identification of individual animals in the United States that provides a nationally unique identification number for each animal. The AIN consists of 15 digits, with the first 3 being the country code (840 for the United States or a unique country code for any U.S. territory that has such a code and elects to use it in place of the 840 code).
4. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
5. CVIs for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
6. CVIs for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.
7. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to any Illinois fair or exhibition. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall be immediately withdrawn and held in quarantine at the owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until the animal is released to return to the owner's premise. Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination shall not be permitted to exhibit and are subject to quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds. Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds. In the event of the suspicion of or diagnosis of a foreign animal disease, emerging animal disease, or other actionable disease, animals may be subject to quarantine on the fairgrounds until such time that it is determined that the disease is no longer a threat.
8. Illinois Department of Agriculture personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue, milk or urine samples from any animal being exhibited and/or raced at any Illinois fair to test for the presence of illegal drugs or banned substances. Examination techniques, such as ultrasound, may also be used at anytime while the animals are on the grounds of any Illinois fair or exhibit. The Illinois Department of Agriculture or designee may collect urine, blood, tissue or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.
9. All exhibitors of animals at any Illinois fair or exhibition shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animal(s) will be excused from exhibition and ordered removed from the grounds with all awards being forfeited. Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical, medical or mechanical application, shall constitute a violation of show rules and may result in the animal(s) disqualification and removal from the fairgrounds.
10. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry.

CATTLE

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear

tag, ("840" tag). The identification tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.
Illinois Cattle

Brucellosis

Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Tuberculosis

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis- Free State. Tuberculin testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Please note: Illinois calves under 6 months of age are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Out-of-State-Cattle

All out-of-state cattle are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

Brucellosis

1. Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the following:

A. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd.

B. Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months of age.

C. Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified)

D. Steers and spayed heifers are not required to be tested for brucellosis.

2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition.

Tuberculosis

1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States

A. No tuberculin test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an Accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois for exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days.

2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)

A. Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.

B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted within 30 days prior to exhibition.

C. Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

All Dairy Cattle (In-State and Out-of-State)

A rRT-PCR test for Influenza A virus (IAV) on milk from lactating dairy cattle exhibiting at the county fair shall be conducted prior to livestock arriving on the fairgrounds. The animals must be sampled no more than seven (7) days prior to the date of arrival and a negative test record must be presented to Department or county fair staff upon request.

SWINE

Illinois Swine

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag, ("840" tag). The identification tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

Brucellosis

Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois swine.

Pseudorabies

Pseudorabies testing is not required for Illinois swine.

Out-of-State Swine

All out-of-state swine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available

online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag, ("840" tag). The identification tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

Brucellosis

1. Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to exhibition unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free state.
2. Swine brucellosis tests for exhibition shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory.

Pseudorabies

1. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement.
2. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
3. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within the 10 days prior to entry.
4. Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

SHEEP

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Market Lambs

All market lambs must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that show lamb fungus can be identified.

Illinois Sheep

1. Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
2. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Sheep

All out-of-state sheep are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

1. Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
2. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

GOATS

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.

Illinois Goats

1. Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
2. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Goats

All out-of-state goats are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

1. Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
2. Tuberculosis- Goats from areas or states that are not Accredited Bovine Tuberculosis Free, must be accompanied by a CVI indicating that the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test has been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and the individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

HORSES, PONIES, MULES AND OTHER EQUIDAE

Illinois Equine

1. All horses and other equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older attending an advertised equine event, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
3. An advertised equine event means a show, rodeo, sale, auction, exhibition, trail ride, or horse fair that is posted or media promoted.
4. A CVI is not required for Illinois equine.

Out-of-State Equine

All out-of-state equine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

1. All horses and other equidae entering Illinois that are twelve (12) months of age or older, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
3. All horses and other equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to entry.

POULTRY

1. All entries (except waterfowl, i.e. domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitor shall show proper information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of the authorized testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed, and species of those tested.
2. Prior to being used to transport poultry to a show, all crates, boxes, containers and vehicles shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
3. Any poultry vaccinations must be performed at least 4 weeks prior to delivery to the show.
4. Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by the official county fair veterinarian or qualified state personnel who shall also receive and examine all certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show. Birds not in show condition will be excused from exhibition and removed from the premises. Any fowl showing signs of illness during the fair will be removed from the exhibition grounds.
5. All out-of-state turkeys must originate from flocks that are officially classified as U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum Clean in accordance with the provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or be negative to a test for Mycoplasma gallisepticum within 30 days prior to entry.
6. A permit is also required for out-of-state poultry. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

PIGEONS

There are no requirements governing the movements of pigeons within or into Illinois.

RABBITS

There are no requirements governing the movements of rabbits within or into Illinois.

1. 4-H or FFA members with projects consisting of beef steers & market heifers, barrows, market lambs, rabbit meat pens, poultry pens, market goats, dairy animals, and carcass animals must follow the steps below to be eligible for the Livestock Sale.
2. **A 4-H or FFA member enrolled in more than one livestock project must notify the Iroquois County Fair Office (not the 4-H Office) by 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday as to the one specie they intend to sell, or they will not sell. To sell on either Auction a 4-H or FFA member needs to sign up when making their 4-H and/or FFA entries.**
3. Animals sold must be an actual part of the member's project and must have been shown in the proper class before they are eligible to be sold in the livestock sale.
4. All questions not covered in these rules shall be taken up by the sale committee. Their decision shall be final.
5. All sales are final.
6. **4-H members who are enrolled in both Nutrition and Livestock projects may only auction off one project. An exhibitor's name may appear only once on the sale bill.**
7. Each 4-H or FFA exhibitor may sell one (1) of the following:
 - a. One Steer, One Market Heifer, or One Beef Carcass
 - b. One barrow, or One Swine Carcass
 - c. One wether, Market Ewe Lamb, or One Sheep Carcass
 - d. One market animal, and all wethers for Goats
 - e. Meat pen of rabbits
 - f. All Fryers & Roasters pens of Poultry, Champion Pen of Turkeys and Champion Pen of Waterfowl, 1 dozen eggs. Reserve Champions may move up to sell.
 - g. Dairy – Basket of Cheese from each Breed Grand Champion, or Dairy Feeder Steer, or Market Steer. Reserve Champions may move up to sell.
8. The order of the Sale will be Swine, Dairy, Sheep, Beef, Rabbits, Goats, and Poultry. Based on this order, the Grand Champions will sell first then the Reserve Champion, Overall Champions, followed by the breed champions. If the Grand Champion elects not to sell the Reserve Champion may sell their animal in its place.
9. An exhibitor's name may appear only once on the sale bill.
10. All exhibitor's MUST be in the sale ring when it's time to sell or they will go to the end of the sale list.
11. All awards, introductions and announcements will be held only from 12:45 to 1:00 p.m. prior to start of the Sale.
12. All extra events MUST be approved by the fair board prior to Sale Day.
13. The exhibitor retains ownership of their animal and handles where it will be going.
14. Each exhibitor will receive a check for the premium money minus the 10% commission.
15. Buyers of the Dairy Baskets of Cheese will receive the basket of cheese.
16. Multiple Buyer Sheet will be available for those individuals who want to create Buyer Groups. Exhibitors do not have to create Buyer groups. Buyer Group Guidelines are as follows:
 - A. All businesses or individuals on the list must have a current Buyer Number. Numbers may be requested by completing a form located on iroquoiscofair.com. Please make sure you talk to your buyers and get permission to use their buyer number, **No bids will be recorded without Name, Address, and Phone Number of Buyer.**

- B. All information must be filled out on the sheet.
 - C. The group leader will be the contact person to help collect the money. The buyer in position number one agrees to cover any overage or underage if the sale amount is different than the total amount of the sheet.
 - D. In the event that this sheet is outbid on the sale, buyers on this sheet who want to still donate may do so. Additions to buyer sheet or final bid can be added during the live sale. Once the final bid has been announced anyone who would like to contribute may do so by raising their buyer number and telling the auctioneers how much they want to add.
 - E. There is a \$50.00 minimum contribution amount per buyer on the sheet.
 - F. Any blank sale amount boxes will share equally the difference between the total amount donations and sale amount awarded on live sale.
 - G. Turn the Multiple Buyer Sheet into your Building Superintendent or person in charge of Buyer Sheets. They in turn will turn in all forms for their department by Thursday night to the Fair Office.
17. Payment is due by August 31st. Beginning Sept. 1, any outstanding balance will be assessed a 2% late fee per month. Any Buyer who does not pay their bill or writes an NSF check will be prohibited from participating in future sales.

OPEN and JUNIOR BEEF DEPARTMENT GENERAL RULES

1. The Open and Junior Livestock rules of the Fair apply to this department.
2. Feed and water troughs must be furnished by exhibitor. Exhibitor must bring their own bedding. No grooming chutes allowed in beef barn.
3. All animals are to remain in tents or barn until 7:00 p.m. Please follow the walkway from the barn to tie outs and cross at the designated area. **Lights out in Barn 11:00 pm.**
4. Stalls will be assigned by the Department Superintendent and will be 4 feet per stall fee paid. Additional space may be purchased in 4' increments @ \$10.00 per space as long as space is available. A maximum of 2 additional spaces may be purchased per exhibitor. All additional space must be accompanied with fees and postmarked by July 3 so that adequate sized tents can be ordered. No refunds.
5. 840 Tag numbers & Tattoo numbers are to be placed on the entry blank under description of animal. This rule will be strictly enforced. 1st and 2nd place winners in each class must be prepared to produce proper pedigree to correspond with the tattoo of the animal shown. 9. Any feeder steers showing symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease or displaying symptoms of health hazard to humans or other animals will NOT be allowed to be unloaded at the Iroquois County Fairgrounds. Examples: ringworm, warts, sore mouth, etc.
10. All feeder steers must be dehorned and healed prior to weigh-in date.
11. Enrolled feeder steers shall be castrated, banded or clamped prior to weigh-in date. Any steer showing evidence at fair of testicular tissue shall be disqualified and sent home.

1. Please read and follow the Open and Junior Livestock rules. They apply to all departments.
2. Eggs should be brought in on Wednesday by 8:00 a.m.
3. American Standard Book of Perfection will be the judging guideline.
4. Feed and water containers to be provided by exhibitors.
5. Birds used in pens may be used in individual classes if banded so as to indicate individual to be used. A pen shall consist of 2 females and 1 male except bantams, ducks, geese, pigeons, quail, pheasants, turkeys and guineas (which can show as a pair, both sexes represented). Minimum age of all poultry is 8 weeks except fryer pens, maximum age 2 years.
6. ALL EXHIBITORS MUST COMPLY WITH ALL GENERAL HEALTH RULES.
7. Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by an accredited veterinarian employed by the management of the show or by an authorized State poultry inspector who shall also receive and examine all health certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show.
8. Animals cannot be penned until checked in by the Superintendent. Exhibitor must present paperwork, proof of blood test or paperwork from hatchery or NPIP breeder.

Open & Junior Class General Project Rules

1. These rules apply to all classes in the Open & Junior General Projects Departments. Please read and follow these rules
2. Open class entries are open to the world. Junior Entries are limited exclusively to Illinois residents. Junior Class entries are open to boys and girls who are 8 years of age or in third grade and not yet 21 years of age on or before September 1 of the year prior to the fair.
3. All non-exhibitors, age 6 and older, must pay daily admission (\$5.00) or have a season pass (\$17.00).
4. The interpretation of all rules governing the Open & Junior Fairs shall rest entirely with the Fair Association and their decisions shall be final.
5. No Alcoholic beverages allowed on the fairgrounds. Use and possession of intoxicating beverages for livestock and human consumption are strictly prohibited on grounds.
6. Unsportsmanlike conduct, abusive language, possession of, or partaking in consumption of alcoholic beverages, fighting, or inappropriate behavior as deemed by the Superintendent and Fair Board Officials will be grounds for dismissal from the fairgrounds and forfeiture of any premiums.
7. No concealed firearms will be allowed on the fairgrounds.
8. No dogs will be allowed on the fairgrounds except for the 4-H Dog Show and those must be on a leash.

Entries

9. Each exhibitor must purchase an exhibitor pass (\$15.00) or senior exhibitor pass (\$10.00) at the time of making entries, a firm being treated as an exhibitor. Only one member of the firm will be admitted to the grounds on this ticket, which entitles their firm to compete or exhibit. 4-H members are given free passes and may not purchase exhibitor tickets.
10. Make entries legible, using entry blanks and supplying all information requested. Exhibitors are requested to submit their entries as early as possible as this will save office work and will be to the advantage of both the exhibitor and association. Social Security Numbers are required on all entries. No exceptions.
11. No exhibitor will be permitted to make more than two entries in any one class which is considered as one premium number. All youth exhibitors that exhibit in the Open Class Building must have separate exhibits for each show.
12. A charge of \$40.00 will be made for all checks NSF.

Exhibits

13. When bringing exhibits to the fair, report to the superintendent in charge of the department in which you have entered. Be sure that your entries are properly made. Attach your entry tags to your exhibit. Please be sure to complete your entry tags with your name, town, and description on them. Remove the claim stub before bringing to the fair. You will need it when checking out articles on Sunday.
14. Judges will be instructed to disqualify all exhibits that do not conform to specifications of the schedule.
15. ALL exhibitors are strongly encouraged to sign up to help watch the Open Building during fair week. Sign-up sheets will be available when you bring in your entries. This is for protection of your exhibits.
16. No article may be exhibited that has won a premium at a previous Iroquois County Fair.
17. Superintendents of each department shall arrange and supervise all exhibits within their department.
18. All superintendents in each department shall have the right and responsibility to settle any controversy which may arise in their department. **Superintendents cannot make changes to the fair book.**
19. Superintendents shall record winners, affix ribbons, and be responsible for returning appropriate information to the Fair Office for payment of premiums.
20. The Superintendents will assure that award books are returned to the Fair Office properly certified by the judge and superintendent of the Department as soon as the awards are concluded. Superintendents

and Judges' affidavits must be signed and notarized before payment of premiums. Payments of premiums can be authorized only upon entries contained in the judge's book therein.

21. No one shall be allowed in the show area while the exhibit is being judged except the exhibitor and helper. Any exhibitor attempting to interfere with judges during their judging will be promptly excluded from competition.
22. The decision of the judges will be final, and no appeal will be considered. Exhibitors may be barred from competition for trying to influence or finding fault with the judges' decision.
23. **PROTEST:** Any exhibitor lodging a protest must first deposit \$25.00 with the Secretary, which sum will be forfeited to the Iroquois County Agricultural and 4-H Club Fair Association if protest is not sustained. All protests must be made in writing, signed by the protester, and be lodged within six (6) hours after showing.
24. Neither the Secretary or any officer of the Fair shall disclose to competitors or any other person, what entries have been made, nor shall any other person, other than the Secretary and officers of the Fair, be allowed to know what other entries have been made before entries close.
25. Exhibitors display their exhibits at their own risk.
26. Sponsors of the show will take every precaution to prevent injury or sickness to exhibitors occurring in connection with the show.
27. While every precaution will be taken by the management to avoid thefts and accidents, the Fair Association cannot and will not be responsible for accidents or damage to exhibitors or anyone in attendance. In no case shall the Iroquois County Fair or any of its officers or directors be held responsible in damages for any loss, damage injury, or disability by disease or from the theft of from any other cause to such property, or to any person coming upon said fairgrounds, while said person or property are on the Iroquois County Fairgrounds.
28. The Iroquois County Fair Association hereby refuses to assume responsibility for the safety as bailee or otherwise, of any property brought upon said fairgrounds—said property being brought upon and kept upon said grounds at the owner's risk.
29. The Iroquois County Agricultural & 4-H Club Fair Association refuses to assume responsibility for injuries to the person of any exhibitor or their officers and employees or to any patron or other persons coming upon the fairgrounds, but no claim for injury to any person or property shall be asserted or suit instituted or maintained against the Iroquois County Fair, its officers, agents, representatives or contractual representatives from said cause by any person having license or privilege to exhibit on the fairgrounds or occupying any space thereon, and it is part of the consideration for such license or privilege that such claims for damages are specifically waived.

Premiums

30. Premiums will be paid out at the pay windows as soon as they are ready. Announcements will be made via the PA system as to when Pay Windows will open. Tentative Pay window hours are noon to 7:00 pm.
31. The Iroquois County Fair intends to award all prizes and premiums listed within the premium book.
32. Payments for premiums are based on the continued funding from the Illinois Department of Agriculture's premium fund for agricultural fairs. The Iroquois County Fair reserves the right to amend premiums and prizes based upon support from this fund.
33. The Treasurer of the Iroquois County Fair Association reserves the right to cancel or stop payment on any check issued by them if not cashed within 60 days after the date of issuance.
34. All premiums will be paid in full, if receipts warrant it, on or before October 1 following the closing of the fair. Premiums will not be paid for any event not held.

3. The contestant must model her own garment in Dresses, Town & Country and Casual wear.
4. Contestant may enter in one age category only. Each contestant will compete according to age of seamstress.
5. Each contestant may enter one ensemble per class. A garment can be entered in one class only.

6. Any suitable fabric or technique (knitting, crocheting, handwoven, needle work, etc.) may be used.
7. Garments may not be entered in both Fashion Show and open class construction in the same year.
8. Check in starts at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, July 19 in the 4-H Center. Judging and Style Show will begin at approximately 5:30 pm following the 4-H Style Show.
9. Contestants should download and complete an information sheet about the garment(s) they are entering for the purpose of narration in the style show. This sheet will ask questions of fabric, pattern and number, accessories to be used and if possible, the cost of the garment. A small swatch of fabric is also requested. 10. This show is to demonstrate how well a seamstress can adapt today's fashions, available fabrics, patterns, and accessories to her own life-style, not strict construction techniques. Therefore, the garments will not be judged on construction other than those points readily visible. Contestants will be judged on a 100 point basis...40 points for the garment on the contestant; 30 points on poise and personality; 30 points on construction.

Iroquois County Fair Golf Cart/ATV Rules and Regulations

1. Only those golf carts/Electric UTV's authorized by the Fair Board will be allowed to operate on the Fair property. No gas ATV's or UTV's will be allowed.
2. The fee for the ability to be able to use the cart on the fairgrounds is \$50.00 for the complete fair. You must also bring a doctor's note stating that you require the use of the cart and a copy of your golf cart insurance. You will not receive your permit until all three items are received in the office.
3. The primary use of golf carts/Electric UTV's is for **handicap accessibility** during the county fair. If you have an accessibility issue and need to bring a golf cart/UTV and wish to apply for a permit, this application needs to be completed for approval by the Fair Board or their representative. All golf carts/Electric UTV's and operators must be registered with the Iroquois County Fair Board. Permits must be displayed in a highly visible area.
 - a. You are allowed to use this cart for accessibility during the Iroquois County Fair. All drivers must follow the following rules and regulations.
 - b. All operators must be 16 years of age or older and have a valid driver's license. **You (the person with handicap)** must be on your cart any time it is being used. If your cart is found being used by others without you being aboard, you may lose your right to have your cart on the fairgrounds. Careless driving or behavior that endangers or would likely endanger any person or property will NOT be tolerated and may result in the cancellation of your privileges.
 - c. The maximum speed is **5 MPH**.
 - d. All golf carts/Electric UTV's are required to yield to pedestrians and livestock at all times. Approach livestock areas carefully.
 - e. No golf carts/Electric UTV's can be operated without headlights and taillights from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise.
 - f. NO UNAUTHORIZED SIGNAGE OR ADVERTISING on cart is allowed.
 - g. No more than the allotted number of people may ride on the golf cart/UTV at any time. Two for a one-seater and four for a two-seater.
 - h. When parking a cart, be sure that the entrances to buildings and pedestrian walkways are not impeded.

GENERAL RULES

CONCESSION & OFF-SEASON EVENT REGULATIONS

1. All concessions and concessionaires on the grounds must comply with the sanitary regulations as required by the Illinois and Iroquois County Health Departments.
2. The Iroquois County Fair Board reserves the right to cancel any contract, if in its judgment, the business or exhibition carried on by the concessionaire, or the manner of conducting the same, is objectionable or not as represented at the time of making contract, and to have the property of the concessionaire removed from the grounds, and all payments previously made under the contract shall then be forfeited. The concessionaire shall bear the cost of any removal or storage fees. After 60 days, all property shall be considered abandoned and become the sole property of the Iroquois County Agricultural & 4-H Club Association, (herein after, referred to as Iroquois County Fair).
3. All food concessions are required to have their own insurance coverage and must produce a certificate of insurance to the fair office prior to the opening of the fair.
4. Payments for space and utilities must be made prior to leaving the fairgrounds.
5. Each concessionaire is expected to deal honestly and fairly with the public, and any attempt at fraud or misrepresentation will be considered sufficient cause for revoking the privilege.
6. Concessionaires and exhibitors will be required to keep their places neat and clean and must remove all litter from within and surrounding their allotted space. They must be operated to comply with Illinois Laws on gaming and pure food laws.
7. Roving concessions or unauthorized vendors will be escorted from the fairgrounds by Law Enforcement.
