LIVESTOCK SALE RULES

- 1. 4-H or FFA members with projects consisting of beef steers or market heifers, barrows, market lambs, rabbit meat pens, poultry pens, market goats, dairy animals, and carcass animals must follow the steps below to be eligible for the Livestock Sale.
- 2. A 4-H member enrolled in more than one livestock project must report the one specie they will sell to the Iroquois County Fair Office (not the 4-H Office) by 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday or they will not sell. An Iroquois County 4-H Livestock and Food Exhibit Information Form must be filled out and submitted with the 4-H or FFA enrollment forms. The Extension Office or FFA Advisor will email a link to complete this online form.
- 3. Animals sold must be an actual part of the member's project and must have been shown in the proper class before they are eligible to be sold in the livestock sale.
- 4. All questions not covered in these rules shall be taken up by the sale committee. Their decision shall be final.
- 5. All sales are final. Each exhibitor will receive a check for the total amount bid minus the 10% commission.
- 6. 4-H members who are enrolled in both Nutrition and Livestock projects may only auction off one project.
- 7. Each 4-H or FFA exhibitor may sell one (1) of the following:
 - a. One Steer, One Market Heifer, or One Beef Carcass
 - b. One Barrow, or One Swine Carcass
 - c. One Wether, Champion Market Ewe Lamb, or One Sheep Carcass
 - d. One Wether or Champion or Reserve Champion 4-H or FFA Market Goat
 - e. One Meat pen of rabbits
 - f. One Fryer or Roaster pen of Poultry, Champion Pen of Turkeys or Champion Pen of Waterfowl. Reserve Champions may move up to sell.
 - g. Dairy One Basket of Cheese from each Breed Grand Champion or Dairy Feeder Steer or Market Steer. Reserve Champions may move up to sell.
- 8. Beginning in 2021 the order of the Sale will rotate its order by barn. The order of selling will be Dairy, Sheep, Beef, Rabbits, Goats, Poultry, and Swine. Based on this order, the Grand Champions will sell first then the Reserve Champion, followed by the breed champions. If the Grand Champion elects not to sell the Reserve Champion may sell their animal in its place.
- 9. All exhibitors MUST be in the sale ring when it's time to sell or they will go to the end of the sale list.
- 10. All awards, introductions and announcements will be given only from 12:45 to 1:00 p.m., prior to start of the Sale.
- 11. All extra events MUST be approved by the fair board prior to Sale Day.
- 12. The exhibitor retains ownership of their animal and continues responsibility for the animal.
- 13. Buyers of the Dairy Baskets of Cheese will receive the basket of cheese.
- 14. Multiple Buyer Sheets will be available for those individuals who want to create Buyer Groups. Exhibitors do not have to create Buyer groups. Buyer Group Guidelines are as follows:

- a. All individuals on the list must have a current Buyer Number. Numbers may be requested by completing the Buyer Registration form located on the website www.iroquoiscofair.com. Make sure you talk to your buyers and get permission to add their buyer number to your form. The Sale Amount will be voided for any line on the form that does not include complete Name, Address and Phone Number of the Buyer.
- b. All information must be filled out on the sheet.
- c. The group leader will be the contact person to help collect all payments. The buyer in position number one agrees to cover any overage or underage if the sale amount is different than the total amount of the sheet.
- d. In the event that this sheet is outbid on the live sale, this sheet will be added to the final sale amount. Additions to buyer sheet or final bid can be added during the live sale. Once the final bid has been announced, anyone who would like to contribute may do so by raising their buyer number and telling the auctioneer how much they want to add.
- e. There is a \$50.00 minimum contribution amount per buyer on the sheet.
- f. Any Sale Amount boxes that are left blank will share the difference between the total value of donations and the sale amount awarded on live sale.
- g. Turn the Multiple Buyer Sheets into your Building Superintendent or person in charge of Buyer Sheets. They in turn will turn in all forms for their department to the Fair Office by 11:00 am on the day of the sale.
- 15. Payment is due from all Buyers by August 31st. Beginning September 1st, any outstanding balance will be assessed a 2% late fee per month. Any Buyer who does not pay their bill in full by December 1st, or writes an NSF check, will be prohibited from participating in future sales.
